### Activity 1:

**Make yourself an invitation to the opening event of the RCM Museum.**

You could write what there will be to see and do!

Which seat row and number are you in?

You can make it however you like – you could put sparkles on it, a special design, or maybe a straight border like this one – it's up to you!

The instruments have been asleep for a long time while the Museum has been closed. Let's wake them up!

## Activity 2:

Sing or play along to the track.

Here are the lyrics:

Wake up!  
Good morning sleepy-head!  
Wake up, wake up!  
Give yourself a shake up!

Here is a score of the tune with the notes written above if that is helpful to you:
