

# Welcome

A very warm welcome to the 2025 RCM Strings Festival. It's a considerable challenge to showcase on just one day the full richness of musical activity that takes place within the RCM Strings Faculty across an entire year but today's events hopefully give you a flavour of musical life at the RCM and feature a wide variety of performances in many different musical styles.

We welcome the LGT soloists, the Sacconi Quartet and students from the Stauffer Academy in Italy, who will be performing alongside RCM professors in concerts later today.

Jazz guitar professor Dr Milton Mermikides brings together current RCM guitarists and alumni in the form of his Eclectic Guitar Orchestra (EGO), highlighting the recent launch of the RCM's Unplugged Exhibition which features the most expensive guitar in the world in the form of Kurt Kobain's Martin guitar (alongside the oldest guitar from 1581 made by Belchor Dias). We also welcome the brilliant young Scottish guitarist Ian Watt who will be performing a lunchtime concert at 12.30pm in the Performance Hall.

Chamber groups from the RCM's Junior Department will be performing in the afternoon concerts and we have workshops taking place for young double bassists.

The music featured across the day ranges from well-loved favourites such as Vaughan William's Lark Ascending and Elgar's Serenade for Strings to lesser-known works in the form of Enescu's Octet which opens the festival. I have also programmed a few personal favourites in the form of Finzi's Eclogue for Piano and String Orchestra and John Ireland's Elegy from A Downland Suite.

There are also many smaller pop-up performances around the building featuring solo and duo repertoire, through to piano trios, string quartets and quintets.

Hopefully there is something for everybody and we hope that you are able to stay and savour as much of the day as possible. You will hear wonderful music in all corners of the building, which in many ways is the perfect way to summarise the RCM. Do also take time to enjoy the RCM Café, where you can relax between concerts.

It is a real pleasure and privilege to work in such an amazing musical environment and (like all great performances) the festival is very much the product of teamwork and collaboration. With this in mind I would like to thank everybody who is performing today and also my colleagues in Faculties and Performance and Programming who have helped to bring the festival together. We very much hope you enjoy the day.

Since its founding by Milton Mermikides in 2006—following his recovery from leukaemia—it has brought together players including John Williams, Paco Peña, Thomas Leeb, and Craig Ogden, performing unique arrangements to raise money for cancer, bone marrow transplant, and other charities. This year marks the 20th anniversary of Milton's life-saving bone marrow transplant. # BACH'S INVENTION: MILTON MERMIKIDES 5PM | PERFORMANCE HALL

This lecture reveals not just the brilliance, emotional depth but the sharp wit behind J S Bach's sublime music. From puzzle canons, hidden messages, mirrored melodies, to playful constraints, Bach still teaches us what makes a true musician: intellect, emotional depth, and generous dash of mischief.

Milton Mermikides is an educator, composer and guitarist with a diverse range of musical interests and outputs. He is the 37th and current Gresham Professor of Music (a post founded in 1597 whose previous incumbents include John Bull, Joanna MacGregor and lannis Xenakis). He is Professor of Music at the University of Surrey and has been the Professor of Jazz Guitar at the Royal College of Music since 2004. Miltonline.com


# Kurt Cobain Unplugged
