REPERTOIRE GUIDE—Choir with Piano/Organ

HANS GÁL (1890-1987)

Widely admired as a composer of opera, ballet, symphonic, chamber and choral music in Austria and Germany before his emigration, <u>Hans Gál</u> wrote more than half of his entire oeuvre in Britain. He taught at the University of Edinburgh, where he continued to develop his highly sophisticated and pleasing style.

JOSEPH HOROVITZ (1926-2022)

A revered teacher and colleague at the Royal College of Music for many decades, <u>Joseph Horovitz</u> achieved widespread critical acclaim and success as a composer of orchestral concertos, chamber music, ballet and film music.

Summer Sunday

- Composed—1975
- Duration—35'
- Orchestration—mixed chorus, piano, optional double bass
- Publisher—Novello
- Notes—a comical-tragical-ecological pastoral; commissioned by The Cookham Festival; Libretto by Gordon Snell





MÁTYÁS SEIBER (1905-1960)

Mátyás Seiber's compositions have been loved and admired all over Europe and beyond, but few know the full range of his output, which includes chamber music inspired by Hungarian folk tunes as well as modernist twelvetone works, large scale orchestral and choral works, songs and film scores.

EGON WELLESZ (1885-1974)

Egon Wellesz was one of the most renowned and widely performed modernist composers of the first quarter of the 20th century. After studying with Arnold Schoenberg for a short period he found his own path as a composer of opera, ballet and chamber music. A highly respected scholar, he became a Fellow of Lincoln College Oxford after his migration to Britain, where he also wrote his cycle of nine symphonies, completed in 1971.
